The extent to which and how the funds will be used to implement prevention and mitigation strategies that are, to the greatest extent practicable, consistent with the most recent CDC guidance on reopening schools, in order to continuously and safely open and operate schools for in order to continuously and safely open and operate schools for in-person learning;</p>
<p>Eagletown Public School plans to utilize ARP ESSER III funds to Prepare, Prevent, and/ or Respond to the Covid 19 impact on our district. The committee recommends purchasing a yellow school bus.</p> <p>Based on CDC guidance for schools, Eagletown is using ARP ESSER III funds to address sanitation issues within the district through additional custodial staff, as well as cleaning/sanitizing supplies. Additionally, adding a bus will help with limiting the number of students that are transported on handicap or regular buses.</p> <p>Eagletown will continue to encourage mask wearing and make masks readily available to students and staff. The district will make every effort to follow the most current CDC guidelines to promote the safety and well-being of our school community.</p>

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2. How the LEA will use the funds it reserved under section 2001(e)(1) of the ARP Act [20% of ESSER ARP Act formula funds] to address the academic impact of lost instructional time through the implementation of evidence-based interventions, such as summer learning or summer enrichment, extended day, comprehensive afterschool programs, or extended school year;

20 % of Eagletown’s total ARP funds (\$341,958.73) will be approximately (\$68,391.74). These funds will be utilized to determine individual student and grade level learning gaps or loss due to Covid 19, and then to address such loss through research-based interventions and programs. As such, the following are recommendations from the Consultation Committee.

FY 24 – Eagletown School will purchase Saxon math and reading remediation material. In addition we will also utilize Star Math, Star Reading, and Star Early Literacy. The math remediation program in partnership with reading intervention will focus on students who are below grade level, while also focusing on students with disabilities and students from lower socioeconomic status environments. Students wishing to recover credits will be allowed to do so with online curriculum and teachers will assist them with this work.

3. How the LEA will spend its remaining ARP ESSER funds consistent with the uses authorized in section 2001(e) (2) of the ARP Act.

In order to maintain operations and continuity of the district in either direct preparation for, to prevent, or in response to Covid 19; or because of loss or revenue due in large part to the same, the District will utilize the various approved funding uses in the following manner:

FY24 – Continued Salary of custodial staff will be paid to reduce risk of virus.

4. How the LEA will ensure that the interventions it implements, including but not limited to those implemented under section 2001(e)(1) [20% set-aside], will respond to the academic, social, emotional and mental health needs of students, and particularly those students disproportionately impacted by COVID-19, including students from low-income families, students of color, English learners, children with disabilities, students experiencing homelessness, children in foster care and migratory students

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Eagletown School will ensure that the interventions implemented, including but not limited to those implemented under section 2001€(1) will respond to the academic, social, emotional and mental health needs of students, especially those students disproportionately impacted by Covid-19, including students from low-income families, minority students, students who are experiencing homelessness, students who are in foster care and migrant students. Eagletown School will use ESSER III funds in coordination with our JOM program, Title I Schoolwide program and Title VI program to provide and maximize enrichment programs that meet the diverse needs of specialized groups. Continued collaboration with the student body, staff, parents, community members, board members and any other stakeholders is key to ensure the success of this plan.
